

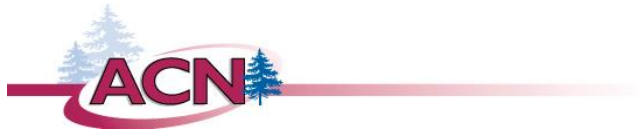
COVID-19 Prescreening Tool
