

Nursing Student Job Description EXAMPLE

Position Purpose:

A Nursing Student (Unlicensed Assistive Personnel) will assist the Camp Nurse and other credentialed healthcare providers caring for the health and well-being of campers and staff.

Requirements:

- -Students matriculating through an accredited nursing program.
- -Current BLS certification.
- -Physically able to walk long distances, carry a backpack weighing 20-30 lbs.
- -Able to emotionally self-regulate, work with others to manage emotionally charged situations
- -Ability to communicate effectively with campers, staff, parents, and peers in a professional manner.

Summary:

The student nurse positions provide the opportunity for a student nurse to provide entry-level nursing care to campers and staff through collaboration using a clinical judgment measurement model: recognizing cues, analyzing cues, prioritizing hypotheses, generating solutions, taking action and evaluating outcomes.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. Assess individual and population health needs.
- 2. Develop plans of care based on assessment findings.
- 3. Collaborate with health care providers to provide care.
- 4. Identify potential hazards within the camp environment, and report findings to camp leadership.
- 5. Participate in health screening activities.
- 6. Provide basic first aid and illness and injury care to campers and staff.
- 7. Complete appropriate documentation in a timely manner.
- 8. Participate in medication management practices.
- 9. Adhere to standing orders provided by the camp healthcare provider.
- 10. Identify and appropriately respond to emergency situations.
- 11. Maintain camper and staff confidentiality.
- 12. Apply basic youth development principles in working with campers through communication, relationship development, respect for diversity, involvement, and empowerment of youth.
- 13. Participate in orientation and training to perform job functions.
- 14. Ability to relate to youth and adults in a positive manner to develop therapeutic rapport.



15. Work effectively as a team member using good communication.

Examples of Specific Activities

- 1. Assist in the daily distribution and recording of camper medications.
- 2. Assist screening and intake processes on camper arrival days.
- 3. Assist with providing basic first aid to campers and staff in accordance with your first aid certification.
- 4. Help supervise individuals in the Health Care Center.
- 5. Supply and restock health supplies and first aid kits; Check equipment according to schedule.
- 6. Document all health services appropriately. Seek supervision when needed.
- 7. Encourage and support staff in their efforts around hydration, sunscreen, bug spray as appropriate for different activities.
- 8. Be alert to equipment and facilities to ensure utilization, proper care and use, and maintenance is adhered to; report repairs needed promptly.

Role Modeling

- 1. Be a role model to campers and staff in your attitude and behavior.
- 2. Follow and uphold all safety and security rules, procedures, and personnel policies.
- 3. Set a good example to campers and others in regard to healthy practices.
- 4. Be respectful to all campers and other staff members.
- 5. Accept constructive feedback regarding performance.

Responsible To:

Reports to on-site RN, nursing faculty, and Camp Director(s)

Qualifications: (Minimum Education and Experience)

- Must be 18 years of age or have completed the first year of college or have the maturity, insight, and judgment necessary to carry out all duties and responsibilities of a nursing student/UAP as assessed by camp administration.
- 2. Must have a valid driver's license.
- 3. Must submit a health history record prior to the first day of clinical rotation.
- 4. Have a genuine interest in working with and concern for children.
- 5. Ability to interact with boys and girls ages 6-18 with varying ability levels.
- 6. A willingness to live and work in a structured group environment that emphasizes teamwork and support for its members.
- 7. Must have the strength and endurance to assist campers in an emergency (fire, evacuation, illness, or injury).
- 8. Willingness to live in a camp setting and work irregular hours with daily exposure to the sun, heat, and animals.



- 9. Prolonged standing, some bending, stooping, walking long distances, hiking, climbing, and stretching; requires eye-hand coordination and manual dexterity to manipulate equipment and supplies.
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
